

ORDINARY TIME

The Church's year is made up of two high seasons (**Lent-Easter** and **Advent-Christmas**) and two blocks of what, in Church language, is called **Ordinary Time**. It is most noticeable in the changed décor of the church. The Easter banners have gone and on most Sundays the priest wears green vestments. Some of the music which is integral to the Mass also tends to be different. We will be in that mode for a good stretch of time, basically until the Advent season begins.

In his apostolic letter approving the Roman calendar (14 February 1969), Pope Paul VI noted some important facts about the liturgical year:

- Over many centuries, Catholics had become accustomed to so many special religious devotions that the mysteries of redemption lost their proper place. This was due to the large number of vigils, holydays and octaves, and to the growing dominance of various seasons over the Church year;
- St. Pius X and Pope John XXIII restored Sunday to its former dignity, so that everyone should once more consider it as the Church's original feast day;
- The Popes restated the traditional teaching of the Church: The celebration of the liturgical year has a special sacramental power and force which nourishes and strengthens the life of Christians. The Church year is not merely a recalling of the historical events by which Christ won our salvation;
- The reason for the restoration of the liturgical year is to help believers through their faith, hope and love to share more fully in the entire mystery of Christ as it is unfolding throughout the year.

HEALTH COOP NEWS

Last autumn, a group of concerned citizens from the Buckingham sector reacted to the problems facing residents with regards to the access to basic health care services. Doctors departed, a clinic closed and there was awareness that other doctors would be taking their retirement thus leading to a realization that an even greater lack of health services in our area was a strong possibility. These concerned citizens formed a provisional committee who set a goal of proposing an alternative to the population.

Strong support was given by the community; 90% of the 1,100 citizens who responded to the survey carried out by the committee declared they would become a member if a health cooperative was created. With this support, the provisional committee mandated the Coopérative de développement régionale Outaouais-Laurentides (CDR-OL) to undertake a feasibility study that would analyze various scenarios for creating a health cooperative that would serve the area of the Basse-Lièvre.

The provisional committee invites the population to an information meeting that will be held on June 22nd 2011 at 7:00 pm in the Desjardins Hall of the Carrefour culturel I'Estacade located in the Hormidas-Gamelin High School located at 580 MacLaren East in the Buckingham sector of Gatineau. During this meeting, the provisional committee will present an overview of the situation facing the basic health care services in our area, the recommended scenario from the feasibility study to create a health cooperative and the subsequent steps for this community project. This meeting will set the path to enable the population to take charge and define the basic health care services on the territory of the Basse-Lièvre. All citizens are invited to participate.

COMMEMORATIVE TREES

The St-Grégoire de Nazianze Cemetery is launching a commemorative tree planting campaign. This is how it will work. Families or individuals interested in purchasing a tree can do so for \$75. The \$75 includes a tree accompanied by a plaque for which the family can remember loved ones or a loved one. Officials will do everything possible to locate the tree as close to the family plot as possible. In some instances, it may not be possible to locate a tree close to a monument, so the cemetery officials would be open to negotiate a suitable location. MILK BAG PROJECT FOR HAITI

These bags are cut into strips and put together to make sleeping mats for the people of Haiti – they are used as packing material to ship products and therefore there is no cost to ship the mats to Haiti. Insects and poisonous spiders do not like the plastic and will not hide in the mat. It takes 300 to 500 bags to make one mat.
