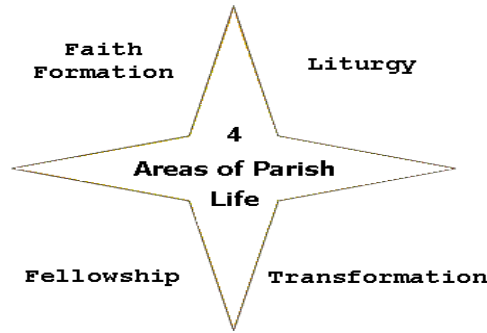

	John the Baptist preached forgiveness. This is one of the special gifts of God, and one of the big celebrations of Advent. We are a forgiven people, and we welcome the forgiveness of God in our repentance.

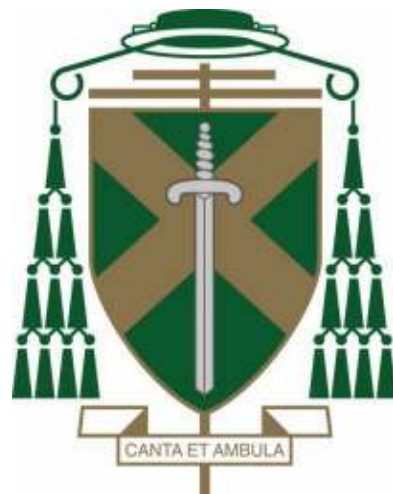
**Most Reverend Paul-André Durocher's coat of arms**

*Bishops and Archbishops have coats of arms that they carefully choose to illustrate their pastoral approach. Still answering our questions, Most Reverend Durocher tells us about their meaning.*

**Question:** Why is there a sword on your coat of arms?

In the same way that, in the Christian tradition, a cross represents the death of Christ, a sword represents the martyrdom of Saint Paul. In fact, Saint Paul was beheaded by the Roman authorities because of his faith in Jesus Christ. Since Saint Paul is one of my patron saints, I have chosen to include the iconographical symbol of his martyrdom on my coat

of arms. Just as I have also included the symbol of my other patron, Saint Andrew: the X-shaped cross on which he also gave his life for the faith. The sword also carries another



meaning, which we can find in the New Testament. In the Letter to the Hebrews, we read that “the Word of God is like a two-edged sword”, for it cuts to the very depths of our selves. The sword on my coat of arms therefore also speaks of the Word of God, the Gospel that has touched me so deeply and has changed my life.

**Question:** Where does your motto come from?

My motto is “Canta et Ambula”, three Latin words which translate as “Sing and Walk.” They are drawn from a sermon Saint Augustine (354-430) preached on an Easter Sunday. Here is an excerpt: “Now therefore, let us sing, not for the delights of rest, but for the easing of toil, as people customarily sing when they are on a journey: “Sing and walk”.

### **THE ADVENT SEASON**

We are moving out of Ordinary Time into the Advent season. The Church looks different; the music, prayers and Scripture readings will be of a different tone throughout Advent.

But Advent is about more than a change of colour and different music. Advent is very much about reawakening in us the hope for Christ's coming in glory, not something to be feared or to be indifferent about, to be eagerly awaited and to even be worked for. In fact, it is a hoping and longing for God's kingdom of peace, justice and love. That is what Christ was sent for in the first place, something that is still far from being reality.

How will we prepare ourselves? The Liturgy Committee has purchased some documents from Novalis in order to help parishioners prepare themselves: a booklet with daily reflections; and a one-page Advent Calendar. The Calendar is on the table at the entrance of the church - there should be enough Calendars for every household. Also on the table you will find various reflection documents – please take whichever one meets your needs.

### **ADVENT WREATH CANDLES**

Candles are available at the entrance of the church at a cost of \$5.00 per set. It is a very simple thing, but it is a concrete way of being reminded at home that as Christians we are in the Advent season. We put the Advent wreath candles in a prominent place, light them as we take a few moments to reflect on the Scripture readings of the day.

### **LIONS CLUB 2011 TELETHON**

The Lions Club annual telethon will be held and broadcast on our local cable station on Sunday, December 4<sup>th</sup> 2010 from 1 PM to 9:00 PM. As we have done now for the last 7 years, our two parishes will participate in the Lions Club Telethon. Contributions to the Telethon can be made by placing your donation – cash or cheque made out to the Lions Club – in a plain envelope marked Lions Club in front, and add it to the regular collection next weekend. Last year, the Lions Club used the funds collected to assist in the following:

- distribution of over 260 Christmas baskets to the needy
- distribution of 200 gifts to children
- distribution of 214 gifts to seniors in CHSLD Papineau & private residences, as well as patients at the hospital
- \$5,000 donation to the children's breakfast club
- \$4,000 donation to the local soup kitchen, La Table de Bethlehem
- \$10,000 donation to La Maison de la famille, Vallée de la Lièvre

Christmas is a time of giving, of thanking God for all we have. It is also an opportune time to reach out and help those less fortunate than ourselves. Please give generously.
