

CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM MGR. DUROCHER Celebrate in Song!

It was Christmas Eve; I was seven years old and so excited that I could not sleep. For the first time, I was to attend midnight mass with my parents. In addition, for the first time, I was to sing solo with the parish children's choir. To calm me down, my father had given me a teaspoon of whiskey but that had no effect whatsoever. I was so anxious about so many things: to go to church in the middle of the night; to sing before the congregation; to return home and celebrate Christmas with my family; and of course, open my gifts. It was to be a magical night.

This memory, as a young boy, is possibly the reason why I have always been in love with traditional Christmas music. These ancient hymns, based on our traditional beliefs, tell us about the birth of Christ, in a way that touches our very being. Today, there are many charming songs that refer to the fable of Santa Claus, his reindeer, sleigh bells ringing and the joys of a winter wonderland. But the traditional Christmas hymns bring us to a different place, a place which is less superficial and based more on the majesty and seriousness of the birth of the Christ child. These traditional hymns tell us a simple but eloquent story of the birth of a saviour, a man who would change the world. A humble birth in an obscure stable under a star-filled sky, to a Blessed Virgin. These hymns convey his message of respect for one another, living a simple life, compassion for both the poor and God, faith, hope and love.

It has been fifty years since I performed my solo. I was so proud because I did not forget one word. Later, I was told that I had hit a few false notes. At that age I didn't quite understand what was being said but I surmised it wasn't a compliment. Today, I tell myself no matter if one's voice is off key, the heart is always in tune as it rejoices in hearing these hymns that are so simple, yet also so profound.

I invite you this year, in the midst of all the stress that impacts our daily lives, to take a moment to stop and really listen to the words of these traditional hymns. Take the time to listen, to savor their meaning and to spend some quiet time in reflection. Sing these songs alone in a moment of solitude, with your family or in a group. Take the time to attend a school concert, or to listen to a children or adult choir. Allow these wonderful words which are so eloquent, yet simple to move and inspire us. And please don't stop listening on the 26th of December. The Christian church does not celebrate Christmas time as a single event but a series of feasts that include the Nativity, the Baptism of Jesus, the feast of Mary Mother of God and the Epiphany. We have all the time in the world to listen to these hymns which reflect our religious beliefs and traditions. And we have the rest of the year to live the message. "Angels we have heard on high, sweetly singing o'er the plains: Gloria in excelsis Deo"
