THE SEASON OF LENT BEGINS WITH ASH WEDNESDAY

This coming Wednesday, our church will look a little different; it will have a Lenten look – *the cross, the ashes, the banners, the purples.* **On Wednesday evening, February 13th at 7:00 pm**, there will be a service at OLV in which we receive the ashes. The receiving of the ashes is a sign that we are serious about the upcoming season of renewal and conversion.

Lent is meant to get us in shape to celebrate the central mystery of our faith: *The death and resurrection of Jesus Christ*. During Lent, the liturgy prepares us for Easter as we recall our baptism and do penance in preparation for the greatest feast of the year. We can mark the journey with the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Prayer	Our Sunday liturgies, with their rich Bible readings, provide the basic orientation for Lent. How about making a special effort to use the FOOD FOR THE WEEK item found on the front cover of the bulletin? Also, you can use any of the various reflection booklets left on the table at the back of the church.
Fasting	During Lent, we could refrain from some food, from a drink, from a party, from a video as a gesture of solidarity with those who have no choice in these matters, for the simple reason that they do not have them. This sort of fasting can also be done to show that we can distance ourselves from so much of what our consumer society says we need.
Almsgiving	This flows naturally from the previous two practices. Alms-giving says we care for others, even to the point of depriving ourselves from something. How about making the money we save this way into our contribution to the special <i>Development and Peace</i> Share Lent collection that will be held later on in Lent?

THE BISHOP IS COMING!



On Sunday, March 10th, the Bishop will be meeting with the parishioners of OLV and St. Malachy's. This visit is in the context of the 50th Anniversary of the Diocese of Gatineau. The Bishop has indicated in his letter that, where the tour involves more than one parish, he would like to meet people who share issues together. For example, in the case of two parishes, he would like to meet the wardens of both parishes together, and at another time, meet members of the leadership teams together. The Bishop wishes to encourage partnerships and would like to use his time in the parishes to foster these partnerships.
