MONTHLY PRAYER INTENTIONS FROM THE ARCHBISHOP - JUNE

"That political responsibility be exercised at all levels of government as a high form of charity"

<u>Reflection on Social Issues:</u> Politics in Quebec and Canada does not always enjoy a good reputation. It is distrusted and ridiculed by many. Yet political activity is noble in that it serves society and the common good. Quebec MPP Martine Ouellette writes in her book: "I understood early on in my career as a political militant that my commitment was a formidable one, a powerful way to change things, to promote the common good and foster social and economic development for people.¹" As Christians, how do we define ourselves in regards to the public square and political activity?

Our Faith Response: In the New Testament, Jesus invites us to build the Kingdom of God. The first believers had to set up communities of believers. These continued to play a spiritual and political role in society. Christians are called to experience a political reflection based on love of neighbour, the common good and a preferential option for the poor. We are invited, through our ecclesial, social and community commitments to let Christian principles inform all of our decisions. How do we apply Christian principles to our decisions?

Sunday 14 June 2015: June 12th was World Day of Prayer for Holy Priests. I reflect on how I can assist priests in living their mission within their own environment, especially in their ministry to the poor.

La Résidence Le Monarque is a non-profit organization located in Montebello that provides free of charge a wide range of palliative care services which also includes support services for the family of the terminally ill. It is a much needed service for this area and needs lots of support. There are presently six beds available for care.

<u>Trying Something New (The Green Envelopes in the Pews)</u> - As of last week and as explained following the Mass, the Parish is attempting to broaden its appeal by looking at a new and creative way to use the tax policy to support fund raising activities. The strategy addresses four types of situations - the theory being that the possibility of receiving a tax receipt will encourage donations from untapped sources.

1. Regular Donors Who Are Not Envelope Holders

Individuals who regularly donate cash to the weekly collection can use these envelopes to obtain a tax receipt for their donations.

2. Visitors/Occasional Church Goers

The presence of these envelopes will hopefully remind visitors and occasional attendees that the Church needs a wide range of support and the provision of a tax receipt could provide incentive to donate.

3. Guests to Family Events

Memorial Masses, Baptisms and Confirmations bring a number of visitors and family not from the Parish. It is possible that these envelopes, with the tax receipt provision, will bring attention to the fact that while the Parish plays an important spiritual role, it needs financial support to continue its mission.

4. Personal Donations

Provides a vehicle to occasionally donate to support parish activities such as the oil conversion project.
