

Jesus did not seem to believe in appearances. Shows of piety and religiousness did not of themselves impress him. He saw behind the tiny amount of money to the huge generosity of the heart in the case of the poor widow.

Jesus often pointed out that religious appearances can be empty and hypocritical. Let me reflect on that this week.

MONTHLY PRAYER INTENTIONS FROM THE ARCHBISHOP - NOVEMBER 2015

"So that we open ourselves up to personal encounters and dialogue with others even those who have different beliefs than ours."

Social reflection: In the 1960s and 1970s, Herbert Marshall McLuhan, a Canadian teacher of Sociology (Studies in Communication) talked about the "global village". Today in the era of the Internet, Facebook, Twitter, etc., we are living in this "global village", where many cultures coexist. Sometimes, these interactions with different cultures may lead to culture shock and misunderstandings. Sometimes, a certain malaise settles itself into the relationship. What must we do in order to fully live inter culturalism in our parish, our town and our country? And why not accommodate (view) our differences as complementary?

Answering our faith: Our Christian faith calls us to fully live the inclusion with people from different cultures. Jesus' message is centered upon meeting others, and seeing the other person as he or she is. Saint John describes the meeting between Jesus and the Samaritan woman (Jn 4, 1-42); from this unexpected meeting between a man and a woman, and between two cultures, life emerged. As a community, how can we include people from different cultures into our celebrations, and into the life of our parish? Maybe these cultural exchanges will bring new life to our community?

Questioning Ourselves Sunday, November 8th, 2015: I look around me to see if there are people from different cultures whom I encounter in my personal life, at work, at church, etc... If so, I try to interact with them on their culture and on mine. If not, I try to meet people who come from a different culture than mine.
